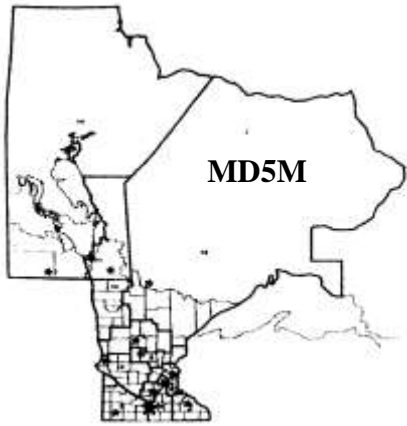

Whatever you do, if you don't wish to keep your old items, make sure you recycle them through Goodwill, Salvation Army or EF.

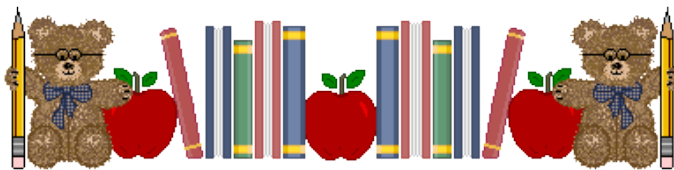




LEOS

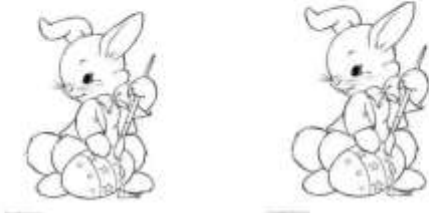

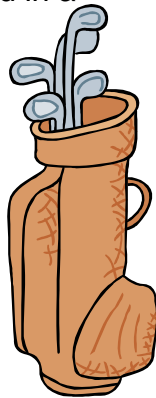

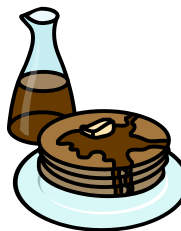
